Subject: PSPF's California Freedom of Information Act (FOIA) Request letter of May 4, 2018

Dear Mr. King,

Thank you for your letter of May 15, 2018 in response to our FOIA request.

Your letter asked us to provide you "with additional search terms and criteria to assist in narrowing the subject matter" of PSPF's FOIA request. Accordingly, we hereby amend our request for those city documents, etc., that contain both the phrase "eminent domain" <u>and</u> an additional search term as follows:

"eminent domain" + "Town and Country" or "Town & Country"

"eminent domain" + "Desert Fashion Plaza" or "DFP"

"eminent domain" + "Pougnet"

"eminent domain" + "Braun"

"eminent domain" + "Grit"

"eminent domain" + "Wessman"

"eminent domain" + "Block K"

Additionally, your May 15, 2018 letter states that the city "will make every effort" to be responsive to our request, but then indicates that you anticipate "an additional 60 days" to process our request. This seems an excessive amount of time to process a FOIA request and we hope that the city can strive to be more responsive. While we recognize that staff resources are limited, responsiveness to FOIA requests are arguably one of the most tangible measures of a city government's commitment to transparency.
