Stephens House Tour

Tuesday, February 21, 2012

The Stephens House (1949), a Class 1 historic site, is an early example of modernist residential architecture by the firm of Clark & Frey. For students of both American popular culture and architecture, the house is particularly noteworthy as it appeared in the September 1955 issue of *House Beautiful* where it helped introduce the idea of "The Family Room" to post-war America.

Twin Palms Estate House Tour

Tour Frank Sinatra's Twin Palms estate (1947) designed by modernist architect E. Stewart Williams. The home was designated a Class 1 historic site by the city of Palm Springs in March 2011 and has been described as "great midcentury design combined with Hollywood lore."



February 24, 2012

At our 2012 Retro Martini Party guests were enthralled by the Leo S. & Ester Maranz House, also known as the "Gull Wing House," designed by architect Val Powelson in 1960. Sited on the Tamarisk Country Club, the home's three-pointed star floor plan is a midcentury architectural wonder rarely open to the public. The Maranz House appears on the cover of the book *Palm Springs Weekend* and became part of television history in 2003 when it served as the backdrop for the reality show "Boy Meets Boy." More interestingly, in large part the home owes its creation to an icon of American pop culture: the Tastee Freez machine. In 1950 Leo Maranz invented a technically novel soft-serve ice cream pump and freezer. Leo formed a partnership with entrepreneur Harry Axene to market the revolutionary invention. Together Maranz and Axene formed Tastee Freez, one of the oldest franchise operations in the United States. We were pleased that current owner Judi Sheppard Missett, the founder and CEO of Jazzercise, joined in the event. This year the vintage evening attire worn by the guests was at pinnacle.














































March 23-25, 2012
