After additional research in recent days, we have determined that the Palm Springs High School Administration Building (1957) is actually the design of the architectural firm of Wexler & Harrison. The building was originally attributed to Williams, Williams & Williams and Clark, Frey & Chambers due to the building's stylistic similarity to the adjacent (and well-documented) auditorium building.

We have since discussed the history of the PSHS Administration Building with architect Don Wexler at length and he remembers this building well. (According to Mr. Wexler our initial misattribution was understandable as "similar concrete block was used on buildings of that era throughout the campus including some Wexler & Harrison-designed buildings that have since been demolished").

As you probably know, the architectural work of Don Wexler was showcased in a major Palm Springs Art Museum exhibition in 2011. Additionally, in 2010 the Palm Springs Preservation Foundation published a tribute journal entitled *Donald Wexler: Architect*.

This architectural "detective story" only underscores the need for a systematic architectural survey of the Palm Springs High School campus as it is now obvious that multiple, highly-regarded, architectural firms were involved in creating the "built environment" of the Palm Springs High School campus.
